Exact test results for each parameter (including any levels exceeding UK or EU safe limits).
- 2. A list of any contaminants, substances, or anomalies found, including the presence of phenols or other industrial pollutants. Details of any advisory notices, exceedances, or corrective actions issued or undertaken.
- 3. Testing Locations and Methodology, including: Identification of where testing samples were taken (e.g., reservoir, Page 2 distribution point, end user location).
- 4. Testing methods used, and laboratories involved.
- 5. Regulatory Compliance Documentation, including: How Yorkshire Water meets obligations under the Water Supply (Water Quality) Regulations 2016 (as amended), Compliance with the EU Drinking Water Directive (Council Directive 98/83/EC), particularly in relation to Article 6 (Quality standards) and Article 7 (Monitoring).
- 6. Any correspondence with the Drinking Water Inspectorate (DWI) or relevant authorities regarding compliance or non-compliance events in my area."

Included with this email are the responses to your questions:

The data requested in relation to sampling is readily available to the public in the public domain via the following link: <u>Yorkshire Water - Drinking water standards</u>. You can input a post code and download a WSZ which confirms the concentrations of the parameters included in the Water Supply (Water Quality) Regulations 2016. There is a link at the end of the report to the Drinking Water Inspectorate which details any undertakings and notices (improvement programmes) that are applicable. The 2024 report has not yet been uploaded and we included this within our response.

Yorkshire Water undertakes routine sampling in line with the requirements of the Water Supply (Water Quality) Regulations 2016. Sampling methodology meets ISO/IEC 17025 (Testing and Calibration of Laboratories) and is independently assessed and accredited by the United Kingdom Accreditation Service (UKAS)
