

# **Ewden Education Centre**

This leaflet contains information to help you get the best out of your visit to Yorkshire Water. We aim to provide you with an exciting and informative experience, bringing to life how clean water arrives at your home and showcasing science, technology, engineering and maths in the workplace.

### **Education Centre Advisers**

Our Education Centre visits are run by dedicated colleagues who either have a water industry or educational background. Our Education Advisers are well-prepared to adapt language and activities to suit all our visitors – whether it be primary, secondary, university students or special interest groups. Each member of the team has received an enhanced certificate from the Disclosure and Barring Service. For visits comprising of primary school students, there will usually be a minimum of two Education Advisers leading the session. All groups are asked to bring a minimum of 1 adult to every 8 students under 16 years of age.

## **Education Centre Visits**

Our visits are suitable for all ages from 8 years upwards.

Visitors with additional needs are welcomed at Ewden. Wheelchair access is limited due to the layout of the site tour, there is no disabled toilet and access to the toilets is difficult with a wheelchair.

We open the Education Centre for pre-planned visits only. Visit co-ordinators wishing to undertake a pre-visit check/risk assessment should contact our Education Team to make suitable arrangements. The treatment works has a designated area for visits and toilets are available.

For visitors taking part in one of our full day programmes, there is a space available for you to eat lunch.

# **Safety on Site**

Please note that the Education Centre is located at an operational Yorkshire Water treatment works and as such we implement safety precautions. We have prepared a risk assessment for your information and can confirm that our Health and Safety Team have authorised the route taken by visitors. Students and adults are advised to wear suitable footwear and clothing. Suitable footwear means a full shoe with a firm sole – no high heels, sandals, flip flops or mules allowed. Please wear warm, outdoor clothing as the treatment works is typically colder than expected.

Hi-vis waistcoats, safety helmets, glasses and gloves will be made available for the tour and are compulsory.

Visiting groups are asked to bring a qualified First Aider. A basic first aid kit is available at the Education Centre should you require it.

Risk is very limited. Visitors are chaperoned at all times by our Education Advisers. Barriers and mesh separate visitors from any areas of high hazard. A safety talk is given at the start of every session and is compulsory.

Please be aware that this is a working site. Visit co-ordinators should note that our site is fully operational and occasionally incidents do occur which may affect the treatment process and our planned tour of the site.

Contractors may be on site undertaking building work. We will ensure a safe tour in all circumstances and will cease tours, or parts of it, if necessary, to ensure visitor safety.

### **Pre-Visit Work for Educational Visits**

Teachers may wish to arrange pre-visit work for their students during class time, however a basic understanding of the water cycle is our minimum requirement. Downloadable resources are available on the Yorkshire Water website or you can order a class resource pack. When you make your booking, we will email you a link to our booking portal. Please complete the form so we can correctly prepare for your session.
