Time limits

Your licence may be subject to a time limit (stated on the front of your licence). All new abstraction licences are legally required to include a time limit. For variations to licences, time limits are added in accordance with our policy.

The duration of a time limit is determined in accordance with our time limiting policy. The time limit is linked to the next or subsequent review of water resources within a Catchment Abstraction Management Strategy (CAMS).

There will be a presumption of renewal providing three tests are met: environmental sustainability is not in question; there is continued justification of need; and water is being used efficiently. Any application for renewal will still be subject to the normal statutory considerations.

If your licence is time limited and you wish to renew it when it expires, you will need to apply for a new licence to replace the existing one. You are advised to submit this application at least three months before it expires. To allow you to give early consideration to this, we will send you a reminder approximately 18 months before the expiry date.

If your licence cannot be renewed, we will endeavour to give at least six years notice. We will also endeavour to give at least six years notice where the licence is likely to be renewed on different terms and will significantly impact upon the use of the licence.

In exceptional circumstances, for example where there are other overriding statutory duties such as the Habitats Regulations, it may not be possible to provide six years notice.

Charges

Unless specifically exempted, we may levy an annual CHARGE for water AUTHORISED to be abstracted by this licence, in accordance with our abstraction charges scheme in force at the time.

The licence may be revoked if charges are not paid.

Quantity and quality of water

You must not abstract more than the quantity specified in the licence.

The Environment Agency does not, by issue of this licence or otherwise, in any way guarantee that the source of supply will produce the quantity of water authorised to be abstracted by this licence, nor that the water is fit for its intended use.

The quantity of water authorised for abstraction is given in cubic metres. One cubic metre is approximately 220 gallons.

(The precise conversion is 1 cubic metres = 219.969 gallons).

Land on which water is authorised to be used

Purpose for which water is authorised to be used

A day means any period of 24 consecutive hours reckoned from 9.00am

- 9.2 At all times when the Licence Holder maintains a gauge in Damflask Reservoir for measuring the distance between the level of water therein and the top water level of 153.92m above Ordnance Datum (Newlyn):
- (i) If the said distance as gauged at 9.00am on any Monday equals or exceeds the value shown in column 2 of the table below, as relates to the number of that Monday in column 1, the quantity of water that the Licence Holder shall release from Damflask Reservoir to the River Loxley on each subsequent day shall reduce from a minimum of 28,000 cubic metres per day to no less than 18,000 cubic metres, until the said distance at 9.00am on any subsequent Monday is equal to or less than the value in column 3 of the table below as relates to the number of that Monday in column 1, whereupon condition 9.1 shall apply. The first Monday in each calendar year is numbered 1 and each subsequent Monday is numbered consecutively thereafter.

(ii) The Licence Holder shall take and record readings of the gauge specified in condition 9.2 at 9am each Monday during the whole of the period during which abstraction is authorised or as otherwise approved in writing by the Agency.

(iii) Each record shall be kept and be made available during all reasonable hours for inspection by the Agency for at least 6 years.

In any day that the flow of compensation water through the Rivelin Gauge to the River Rivelin at National Grid Reference SK 28786 86925 exceeds 10,300 cubic metres required under the conditions of licence number 2/27/05/029 then the quantity of water that the Licence Holder shall release from Damflask Reservoir to the River Loxley shall reduce by the amount of that excess but shall be no less than 18,000 cubic metres per day.

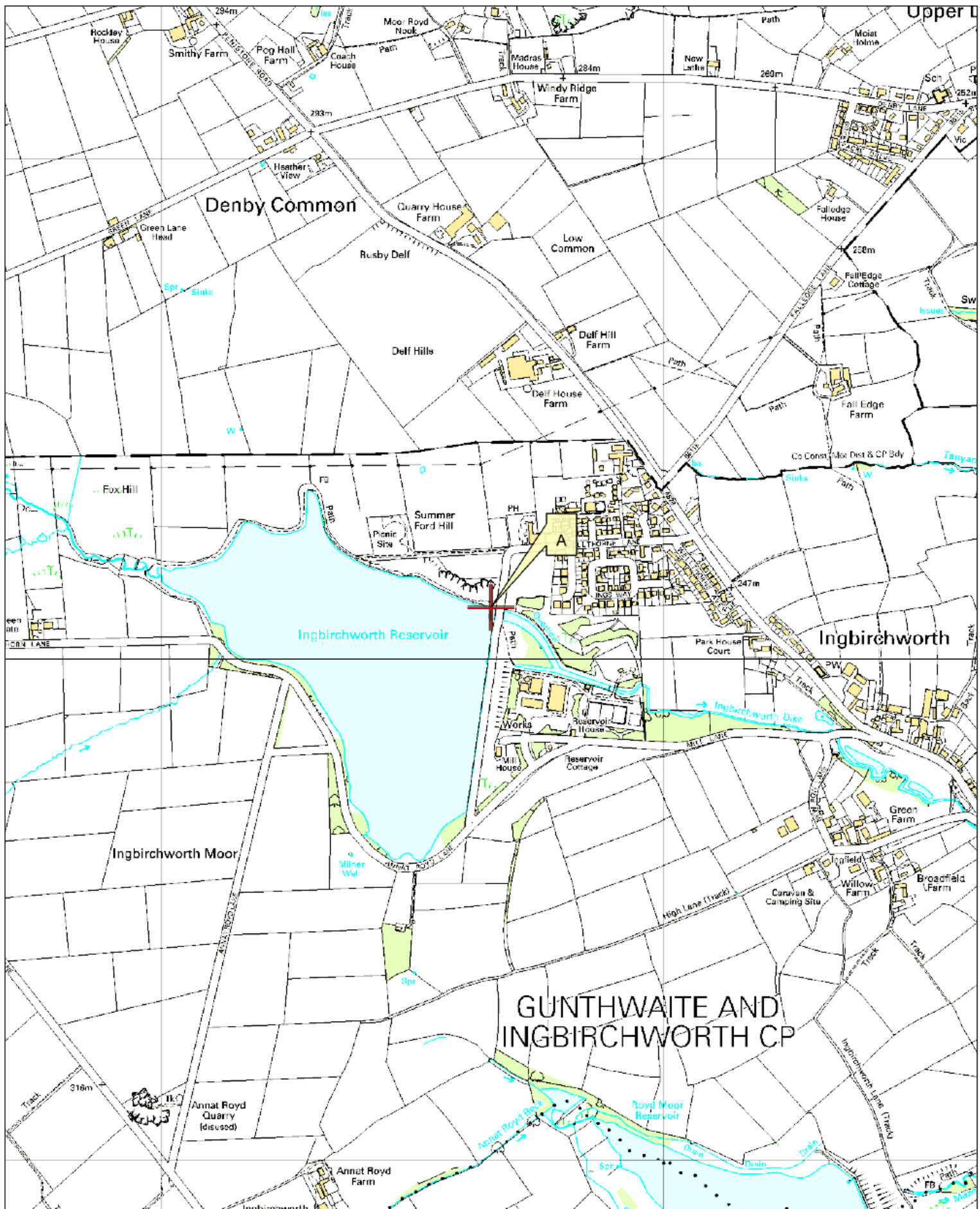

You may abstract from the point(s) specified in the licence and from no other points. If you want to add or change the authorised point(s) of abstraction, you must apply to us to vary the licence.

Land on which water is authorised to be used

Where this condition applies, you may only use the water you abstract on the area specified in the licence. You must apply to us to vary the licence if you wish to extend or alter this area or remove it.

Purpose for which water is authorised to be used

You may only use the water for the purpose(s) specified in the licence. You must apply to us to vary the licence if you wish to add to or change the purpose(s).

Offences

Under the Water Resources Act 1991 it is an offence:-

- to abstract water, or cause or permit any other person to abstract water, unless the abstraction is authorised by and in accordance with an abstraction licence, or is subject to an exemption;
- to do anything to enable abstraction, or to increase abstraction, except in accordance with an abstraction licence or exemption;
- to fail to comply with the conditions of an abstraction licence.
Note in particular that it may be a condition of the licence to maintain the meter or other measuring device etc. and failure to do so will be an offence;
- to interfere with a meter or other device which measures quantities of water abstracted so as to prevent it from measuring correctly;
- to fail to provide information which we have reasonably required for the purpose of carrying out any of the Environment Agency’s water resources functions;
- to knowingly make false statements for the purpose of obtaining a licence or consent or in giving required information.

Right of appeal

If you are dissatisfied with our decision on your licence application, you may appeal.

Members of the public are also entitled to ask us for other “environmental information” it holds, including any activities likely to affect “the state of any water” or any “activities or other measures designed to protect it”. That would include the information additional to the licence document e.g. any related agreement or abstraction returns. - 8.2 The Licence Holder shall send a copy of the record required by condition 8.1 or summary data from it to the Agency within 28 calendar days of 31 March in each year or within 28 calendar days of being so directed in writing by the Agency.
- 8.3 Each record shall be kept and be made available during all reasonable hours for inspection by the Agency for at least 6 years.

9. FURTHER CONDITIONS

SPECIAL CONDITIONS

Licence Serial No. 2/27/5/152.

1. A gauging weir shall be constructed by the licence holder on the River Don at National Grid Reference SE. 163024 in advance of the construction of Winscar Dam and shall be equipped with apparatus to measure and record the flow of water passing over it and such apparatus shall be maintained by the licence holder in good order and caused to operate from the time of commencement of construction of the Winscar Dam.
2. From the time of commencing to impound water in the new Winscar reservoir, compensation water shall be discharged from the Winscar reservoir and/or Lower Windleden reservoir in such quantity that the flow of water passing over the gauging weir shall not at any time during the months of November to April inclusive fall below 105 litres per second (2 million gallons per day) nor at any time during the months of May to October inclusive fall below 137 litres per second (2.6 million gallons per day).
3. Condition No.2. shall be reviewed not later than 1st March, 1979.

NOTES

1. Reasons for Conditions

Reasons for the imposition of conditions and for any material departure from the proposals in the application are set forth at the foot hereof.

2. Right of Appeal

If the applicant is dissatisfied with the decision of the River Authority on his application, he may, by notice served within one month from the date of receipt of this notice, appeal to the Minister of Housing and Local Government in accordance with Section 39 of the Water Resources Act 1963 and the Water Resources (Licences) Regulations 1965 (S.I. 1965 No. 534). The Minister has power to allow a longer period for the giving of a notice of appeal.

3. Offences

It is an offence under the Act (Sections 36(1) and 49) for a person after the 30th June, 1965, to begin, or cause or permit any other person to begin, to construct or alter any impounding works* at any point in an inland water in a river authority area (not being an inland water falling within Section 2(3) of the Act) unless-

- (1) a licence under the Act granted by the river authority to obstruct or impede the flow of that inland water at that point by means of impounding works* is in force, and
- (2) the impounding works* will not obstruct or impede the flow of the inland water except to the extent, and in the manner, authorised by the licence, and
- (3) any other requirements of the licence, whether as to the provision of compensation water or otherwise, are complied with.

The penalty on conviction of an offence is a fine (not exceeding, on summary conviction, £100).

* This expression means either of the following, that is to say-

- (a) any dam, weir or other works in an inland water whereby water may be impounded, and
- (b) any works for diverting the flow of an inland water in connection with the construction or alteration of any dam, weir or other works falling within (a).

4. IMPORTANT NOTICE TO A SUCCESSOR TO THIS LICENCE

If you have become the holder of this licence, in accordance with Section 32(1), or regulations made under Section 32(3), of the Water Resources Act 1963, by succeeding to the previous licence holder's occupation of land specified in the licence as land on which water abstracted in pursuance of the licence is to be used, you should note that, by virtue of Section 32(2) of the above Act (or corresponding provisions in the regulations under Section 32(3)), you will cease to be the holder of the licence at the end of a period of one month from the date on which you became the occupier of the land in question unless before the end of that period you have given the River Authority notice of the change in the occupation of the land.
