

Route Fact File	
Location:	1½ miles north of Osmotherley town centre
Difficulty:	1 Boot
Route Length:	1½ Miles / 2 Kilometres
Walking Time:	1 hour
Terrain & Gradient:	The entire route on Yorkshire Water land within the boundary fence is wide, well surfaced and mostly flat apart from a gradual incline and decline at the end of the walk. Please note, the path outside of the boundary fence is a bit narrow in places.
How To Get There:	<b>By car:</b> Car parking is available to the North of Cod Beck Reservoir, DL6 3AL.
	From the A19: Take the A684 exit towards Northallerton and turn sharp left onto A684 shortly after. Follow the road as it bears left and take the next right onto Clack Lane. Follow this road into the centre of Osmotherley and turn left onto North End. Follow this road for 1.5 miles where the 2 car parks will be on your right just north of Cod Beck Reservoir.
	<b>By public transport:</b> There is currently no public transport available to Cod Beck Reservoir.

Just North of the picturesque North York Moors
National Park village, Osmotherley, Cod Beck
Reservoir is an easy going short walk. The North
York Moors are one of the largest expanses of
open heather moorland in the United Kingdom.
The walk has no steps, stiles and the gates can
be opened wider with RADAR keys for increased
mobility.

## **Route Description:**

Find your way to the smaller car park **point 1**, which is closer to the reservoir boundary fence. From this car park, find the path which runs parallel to the road within a few metres of it, heading towards the green gate. Head through the gate and follow the path in front of you for the entire length of the reservoir.

At **point 2**, turn left onto the embankment. At the other end of the embankment, turn left in front of the woodland at **point 3** to follow the reservoir back round with the water on your left. Just before the end of the reservoir, the walk enters a woodland and curves left down towards a bridge. Cross the bridge and head through the green gate in front of you. Follow the path back to the small car park at **point 1**.
