

Route Fact File	
Location:	3 miles North of Skipton just off the A59.
Difficulty:	Two boots
Route Length:	1 mile/1.6km
Walking Time:	45 minutes
Terrain & Gradient:	The terrain consists of a mixture of wide tracks with a fairly rough surface and grassy paths which can be wet and muddy. There no stiles but a few steps. Most of the gradients are gentle except for a short steeper section leading down to the footbridge (point 2).
How To Get There:	This walk starts at Embsay Reservoir car park just off Pasture Rd, Skipton BD23 6PR (Point 1).
	By car: From Skipton, take the A6131 towards Settle, Kendal and Grassington. After 2miles, turn left onto Skipton Road. Follow the road for another mile into Embsay and turn left onto West Lane. After 0.3miles, turn left onto Pasture Road. Follow this road, ignoring the blue Yorkshire Water sign for the treatment works. The car park will be on your right.
	By public transport: There is a bus stop in Embsay on Main Street a mile away from the reservoir walk.
	For up to date travel information from any location visit google maps to search directions.

Near the market town of Skipton, on the outskirts of the village of Embsay, this short circular walk around the Embsay Moor Reservoir gives wide views over the surrounding fields and moorland edge including Embsay Crag. The walk is 1 mile long.

From the car park **point 1**, facing the reservoir, walk through a gateway onto the embankment. Follow the embankment track with the reservoir on your left. At the opposite end of the reservoir, pass through a gate on your left onto a grassy path.

Follow the waymarked posts around the reservoir to a footbridge at **point 2**. Cross the bridge and continue following the waymarked posts around a fenced off Nature Recreation Zone. The path follows the fence line to the boathouse where you will find a pedestrian gate on your right. Go through the gate and turn left to follow the track back to the car park at **point 1**.
