

Route Fact File	
Location:	3 miles north of Penistone, just off the A629
Difficulty:	Two Boots
Route Length:	1¼ Miles / 2.1 Kilometres
Walking Time:	1 hour
Terrain & Gradient:	From points 1-3 along the northern edge of the walk, the path is a wide surfaced track. As the walk continues past point 3 , it becomes muddy with lots of tree roots covering the path There are no steps or stiles. Sturdy boots are recommended for this walk.
How To Get There:	By car: on-street parking is located near point 1 on Wellthorne Lane, S36 7GN.
	From Penistone: take the B6462 heading north for about a mile, until you reach the A629. Turn left and continue on the A629 for the next mile and a half, then turn left onto Wellthorne Lane.
	From Shepley: follow the A629 south. After about 3 miles, turn right onto Wellthorne Lane.
	By public transport: There are bus stops a 5 minute walk from the start of this route, near where Wellthorne Lane meets the A629.
	For up to date travel information from any location visit google maps to search directions.

This not too strenuous route revolves around
Ingbirchworth Reservoir, running next to the
water's edge and passing through small areas of
woodland. The path is unsurfaced in places and
can be muddy. Sturdy footwear is recommended.
The walk is 1¼ miles long.

Route Description:

From the lay-by on Wellthorne Lane, head towards the gate at the bend in the road (**point 1**). Go through the gap in the wall and onto the track, which heads west and drops down-hill to a gap in the reservoir boundary wall at **point 2**.

Turn right and follow the obvious path round the northern end of the reservoir and over the boardwalk at **point 3**.

Continue along the path through the woods, keeping the reservoir on your left, until you reach a squeeze stile in the wall at **point 4**.

Turn left here and walk over the embankment along the pavement, which leads you back to **point 1**.
